WinSport's Servus Tube Park opens Saturday for winter season

CALGARY, Alta. – WinSport is excited to announce that the Servus Tube Park will open Saturday for the 2021-22 winter season.

The tube park, which begins its sixth season of operation on the east side of Canada Olympic Park, features eight lanes of fun for the entire family, with a dedicated magic carpet to take guests back up to the top of the hill.

Three two-hour sessions (10 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 3 p.m.) are available on Saturdays and Sundays throughout the winter, with closing day currently scheduled for April 2nd. The tube park will be open daily during the holiday season, except for Christmas Day, from Dec. 24 to Jan. 8, with three sessions daily.

Thanks to WinSport's partnership with Servus Credit Union, Servus Tube Park Fridays are returning this season, where guests enjoy 40% off regular-priced tube park tickets on seven dedicated Friday nights. The first Servus event is Jan. 13, with sessions at 4 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.

Guests are encouraged to purchase tickets online in advance at winsport.ca as each session is capped to limit capacity. Tickets can then be picked up at new dedicated Servus Tube Park ticket booth and entrance, which is located by the northeast corner of the Frank King Day Lodge parking lot.

Please note that the minimum age requirement is four years old, with a minimum height requirement of 36 inches/92 centimetres tall. Children below this height are not permitted to ride.

Helmets are not mandatory but are recommended. Guests may bring their own or rentals are available.
